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Jonathan has extensive experience in Pennsylvania administrative law, particularly public utility law. He has represented a wide range of clients, including public utilities (large and small); boroughs, counties, and other municipal corporations; real estate developers and other public utility consumers; and even medical marijuana providers. He has experience in every regulated utility industry in Pennsylvania: water, wastewater, steam, gas, electric, transportation, and telecommunications. Jonathan has assisted clients in completing complex transactions and has represented them in litigation before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, the Pennsylvania Department of Health, and the Pennsylvania Office of Open Records, as well as the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania and the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania. Rate Cases

- Represented Pennsylvania-American Water Company in its 2020 Base Rate Proceeding before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, which was fully litigated with strong opposition from the Pennsylvania Office of Consumer Advocate and the Pennsylvania Office of Small Business Advocate, among others, who argued against a rate increase because of the economic circumstances caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. In a 152-page Opinion and Order, the PUC approved an annual revenue increase of \$70.5 million, finding that PAWC was constitutionally entitled under the Takings Clause to a return on and of its investment in providing service to the public. To mitigate the impact on low-income customers, PAWC implemented enhanced customer assistance programs and delayed utility service terminations for non-payment (PA PUC Docket No. R-2020-3019369).
- Represented Hidden Valley Utility Services, L.P., in a case seeking PUC approval to raise water and wastewater rates for the first time in more than 13 years (PA PUC Docket Nos. R-2018-3001306 and 3001307).
