For the Whitney, Christ also advocated to amend the State Hudson River Park Act to permit installation. Additionally, Christ was a Stonewall Democratic Club and Queens Borough Hall LGBT Pride Month Celebration honoree and a City & State Magazine's Top 10 LGBT Pride Watch List honoree.
