After moving into private practice, Julie gained experience litigating sophisticated civil matters, including large property and casualty matters for a post-merger entity where she had previously served as in-house counsel.

Julie currently serves as an adjunct professor of law at the University of Illinois-Chicago Law School, teaching appellate advocacy skills.
